Mr. Grant's latest lectures: the results of eight photographic expeditions to the Gaspé Peninsula of eastern Canada and the great seabird colony on Bonaventure Island at the tip of Gaspé — all the charm of travel in this quaint Acadian country; all the thrill of search for new scientific knowledge; all the adventure of making intimate motion pictures of far-wandering birds in their precipitous sea-cliff homes — that can be packed into a program.

The title "Gaspé, and the Birds of Bonaventure," allows as much of the emphasis to be placed on the popular auto tour—the charming scenery, the people and their fishing—as is desired.

"Gannet City of the Gaspé" is a study of the eight species of cliff-dwelling seabirds of the Gannet colony—thrilling photography of breath-taking beauty.

"Pirates of Percé," or "Peregrines of Percé," is the story of these bird-cliffs from the point of view of the Peregrine Falcon or Duck Hawk—our most dashing American bird of prey—the robber baron of this great seabird city.

Any combination of the above subjects can be arranged. Illustration will be selected from 4,000 feet of 35mm or 16mm safety motion pictures, 4,000 feet of 16mm color motion pictures, and 300 natural color slides.
