

McGILL UNIVERSITY CONTINGENT CANADIAN OFFICERS TRAINING CORPS

Perpetuates C.E.F. Unit (148th Bn. C.E.F.)

Formation authorized November 1st, 1912, and is the oldest Canadian Contingent. On outbreak of Great War in 1914, establishment increased to full Battalion and Contingent supplied Officers and personnel to C.E.F., Units and officered, organized and trained 148th Infantry Battalion C.E.F., whose name it perpetuates, with Battle Honours: Arras, 1917-1918 Hill 70, Ypres, 1917, Amiens, Hindenburg Line and Pursuit to Mons. As re-inforcement for Princess Patricia C.I.I., the Contingent sponsored the organization and training of six Universities Companies, officered and recruited mainly from all Canadian Universities.

On outbreak of war, September 3rd, 1939, enrollment increased to 1470 and Contingent is training Officers for C.A.S.F., and N.P.A.M. Units.
