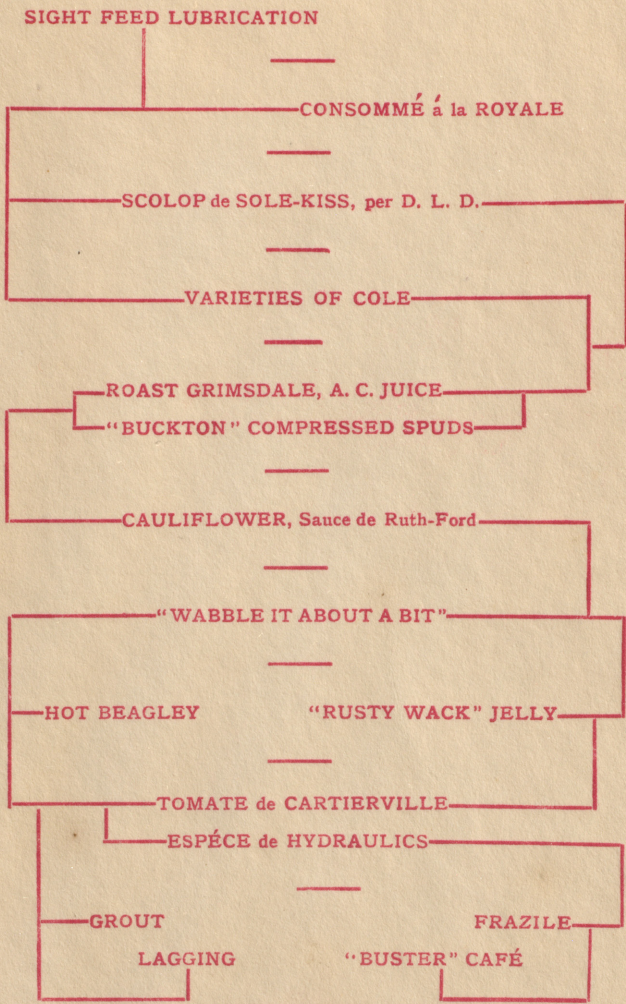






# Diagram of Connections
