


(1) Our present time-table existing this session is, on the whole, satisfactory except that Commerce has bad hours - in the afternoon, two days running.

Dear Professor Hatcher:-

Our present schedule is satisfactory excepting in the case of Philosophy 6, Logic and Metaphysics given by Professor Porteous. In lieu of an afternoon hour he would like to get it in Monday-Wed-Friday 1) at 10 o'clock, or 2) at 11 or else 9 o'clock. The class is a very small one, and possibly it will always be possible to arrange privately with the students themselves, though it be listed for the afternoons. There is, of course, the question of a room for it, but this year one has been found.

Otherwise our schedule is satisfactory. I should like to request particularly, however, that if any changes are made, courses 2, 4, and 5 be kept on the same day, and 3, 6, and 8 likewise, the two sets being given by Professor Porteous and myself. The primary concern of our Department is to have our work so grouped that we can get days for some original work of our own and not be at the mercy of our routine hours.

The second consideration is that our "general courses" 1, 2, 3, and 4 be given in morning hours because they are then available to the greater number of our undergraduates, some of my students at present having work for the afternoon, necessary for their livelihood.

Any further information you desire I shall be very pleased to furnish, because I am not anxious to discover some change laid down in the "law" which will bind us to something we do not want. Your request was meant to forestall that and I am grateful for it.


