
Dear Sir:

Dear Dr. Hatcher,

With reference to your request of January 20th. in regard to Time-tables, etc., I am enclosing a set of tables which shows the use of rooms in the Physics Building in so far as lectures, laboratory and research are concerned.

Notes

<sup>HT</sup> The course numbers refer to those used in the Arts Bulletin, with the exception of courses 311, 312, 315, 316 and 318, which are listed in the Applied Science Bulletin.

Where two numbers are given, as for example, 3A and 315, it means that these numbers refer to the same course.

The person named is the lecturer for that hour. The word "Prep" refers to the preparation of experiments in cases which definitely tie up the use of the lecture room for the hour named.

It will be noted that Room 102, which is our large lecture theatre, is so completely occupied that any changes or adjustments can only be made with the utmost difficulty.

The other two lecture rooms, Nos. 207 and 210, are also so well occupied that some lectures have to be given in Room 59 (which is a laboratory) at the times shown; Room 400 (which is an attic, laboratory and office), and in Room 203, which is a professor's office.

PHYSICS

A consideration of these time-tables will show why it is not possible for us often to meet requests from students to change particular hours in order that they may attend other courses, or because other courses have had their hours changed.

We really need another large lecture theatre, and another small seminar room.

At the beginning of each session one of the worst difficulties in adjusting our time-table arises from the fact that several courses are joint courses for two faculties, and also that they include (in two cases) students from several years; furthermore, all the students of one year are not taking the same other courses.

If you have any questions to ask about our time-table plans or difficulties kindly let me know.
