I beg to acknowledge receipt of your letter of March 9th and feel that to you it would be well to make the following explanation:

CANCER RESEARCH WORK CONTINUES

Conditions of Award of Lord Atholstan's \$100,000 Prize Offered for "Cure" More Fully Defined

Laymen were greatly interested and the medical profession greatly encouraged nearly a year ago by the announcement through the press of the world that Lord Atholstan had offered a prize of \$100,000 to the graduate or student of any recognized university who, within five years, could discover a medicinal treatment for the effective cure of cancer.

Lord Atholstan's offer was made, so far as Canada was concerned, in a letter written on January 23, 1922, to Sir Arthur Currie, principal of McGill University, and since that time 2,715 claims for the prize have been made by residents of England, Scotland, Ireland, Wales, the United States, France, Italy, Belgium, Holland, Denmark, nearly every country in Europe, Asia, Africa and America. Practically every province in the Dominion of Canada has had its claimant.

A circular has been issued explaining more fully the conditions of the award, in order that claimants may attempt to meet the demands more explicitly than heretofore. The decision of the award, it may be recalled, was left by Lord Atholstan to the Royal Colleges of Physicians and Surgeons, London, and the following extracts from a letter received by Lord Atholstan from that body have been quoted for the guidance of competitors:

Conditions of Award

Office of the Imperial Cancer

My Lord,—

Referring to your offer of a prize of "one hundred thousand dollars to the graduate or student of any recognized university who within five years after date is the first to discover a medicinal treatment for the effective cure of cancer, the decision to be left to the Royal Colleges of Physicians and Surgeons, London, England,"

The Imperial Cancer Research Fund is under the superintendence of the Royal Colleges of Physicians and Surgeons, and we suggest that any question that may arise in regard to the prize offered by you should be referred to the executive committee of that fund.

We suggest for your approval the following procedure to be adopted:

1. All applications must in the first place satisfy a recognized medical faculty or a leading medical society in his or her own country (a) that there is some scientific basis to justify experimental investigation of the professed cure, (b) that any cases said to be successfully treated were, in fact, cases of cancer.

2. Applicants must disclose to the medical faculty or medical society investigating the professed cure its nature and ingredients and the method of preparation.

3. Applicants who have satisfied the above conditions should request the medical faculty or medical society to report to the Imperial Cancer Research Fund.

4. The Imperial Cancer Research Fund will then determine the means to be adopted to investigate the claims of the applicant, if the Committee is of opinion that a case for investigation has been made out.

Within a few days of the receipt of your letter (offering the prize of \$100,000) your cable offering another \$100,000 for cancer research was received, with the result that a special investigation is now being carried on with the funds you have so liberally placed at the disposal of the Imperial Cancer Research Fund.

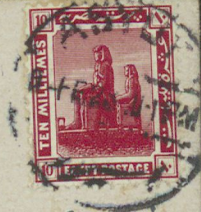

I have the honour to inform you that, having read: "The principal of the University of Montreal has been notified that an English peer, Lord Atholstan offers a prize of \$100,000 for a discovery which will dispense with a surgical operation for cancer", I am sending you this discovery and beg Lord Atholstan to institute, with the \$100,000 an experimental clinic which will certainly give a radical cure by my therapeutic method, by the emanations of asphyxiating gases.

Twelve years of experiments on cancer have proved to me that cancers, tubercles, microbes, herpes, ~~vegetation~~ growths, cataracts - all that ^{which} lives dies and disappears by the ingestion of asphyxiating remedies such as coaltar and by asphyxiating gases like coal gas, which I have applied to the eyes, the intestines, the uterus by the means of eye-flaps and of orthopedic apparatus.

It is only after having tested during ten years the formulae of the

pharmacopœia, and of pharmaceutical products that my observations and researches ^{have} enabled me to discover that the remedy could have results only by the emanations of asphyxiating gases.

I chose coaltar and coal gases because they are not corrosive - Pine tar is not an asphyxiant -

In a few months, six at most, ~~the~~ ulcers are healed and ~~the~~ cancerous tumours (glands) disappear, leaving in their place a kernel the size of a pea. This kernel has germs (roots) which are sometimes more than thirty years old, of terrible resistance. That is why the method must be continued until they ^{have} completely disappeared. This takes place ~~in~~ very slowly but surely. ^{If} the ~~treatment~~ ^{use} is continued with^{out} interruption during two years the cure is nearly radical. Besides, this method can be followed during one's whole life; it gives a general improvement and has the peculiarity of rejuvenating the person who makes use of it.

The dose to be taken is determined by soaking a piece of wire of about 3 millimetres which has been attached to the cork of the bottle containing the coaltar, and in letting a drop the size of a pea fall on a piece of sugar. After the

coaltar has penetrated the lump of sugar, you put it on the tongue; then with a little of your favourite drink you melt it and swallow it without any reluctance - Repeat this operation after each meal, regulate the size of the drops according to the way the stomach stands the treatment. Begin by small drops, and one easily becomes used to it.

Apply compresses of coaltar on the parts of the body affected by the cancer if it is interior and on exterior ulcers and tumours.

If the cancer is in the intestines or in the uterus, make injections with coaltar mixed into an emulsion with saponine or any other substance which will make it sufficiently liquid and bearable - Begin with a weak formula.

One can impregnate the blood just as easily by respiration as by injections. That is why it is indispensable to use the emanations of coaltar and of gas. Later, there will be lozenges containing 10 centigrammes of coaltar - a new remedy.

For greater cleanliness, one may with the doctor's aid, replace coaltar by coalgas but it must be used only with a small balloon - one must not

use a gas jet in the room. It would be extremely dangerous for explosions and asphyxiation. By taking the necessary precautions, it may be used to with advantage for the intestines and the uterus by the means of orthopedic appliances. - The idea is to asphyxiate the cancer by all ^{possible} methods intelligently applied.



I have consulted a large number of medical men and others in the hope of getting relief if not a cure, but up to the time I commenced the treatment recommended by Mr. Septimus Bright I found nothing to do me any good; but now I am able to get about my ordinary household duties without any interference, and feel stronger and better ~~in~~ every day, and the Cancer which is internal, is rapidly expelled.

You will be surprised to see I am in ----- (200 miles from home) but hope to be home in a few weeks. I am getting on very well; in fact my daughter says she never saw me looking so well in her life, and she has just turned 30.

Dear Sir:

Enclosed herewith please find copy of my letter of Sept. 11, 1922, from your office of Sept. 9 and from the Montreal Star of Sept. 3, received but nothing further.

My former letter has caused something of a furore, you state the position. ^{1st} The dictionary was made while in being as a medical officer in the British army, and the British Government has a great claim. ^{2nd} The officer in question stated a point in my regulations ^{but} because of the same particularly applied with cancer and because of the necessary cooperation of the medical profession at that time. ^{3rd} After five generations only two of us, my brother and myself, can use it effectively against cancer and my two people are treated.

My father was the only one in his generation who took much interest in the treatment, ^{but} gave me a verbal history of the discoverer's experiments, and the different matters that must be used according to climate, and the why of the use of the different chemicals. My brother a mechanical Engineer, has carried out a series of experiments. We have sent to different members of the family and collected information by my list, and received treatments again to, something of a science, and Dr. Dr. Day of Bytown, one of the few public opinion doctors and having the largest practice in the district has given me considerable assistance; many members of the family would be present and interested if any money were to be distributed, and such a course would be ^{the best} ^{to the} ^{benefit} ^{of} ^{the} ^{patients}. Union University, Chicago, a branch of Victoria University Toronto, is a pioneer of American and Canadian Medicine. Gaster and Green A's and so far has not found a scheme of practical science which they have planned for myself here for effective ⁱⁿ ^{the} ^{case} ^{of} ^{cancer} ^{with} ^{it}.

Cause of Cancer.

Bad tissue ^{is} ^{the} ^{cause} ^{of} ^{cancer} ^{is} ⁱⁿ ^{some} ^{way} ^a ^{part} ^{of} ^{the} ^{cancer} ^{itself}. The discoverer ^{of} ^{my} ^{theory} ^{is} ^{that} ^{no} ^{theory} ^{has} ^{been} ^{set} ^{up}. This was kept till my grand father started to practice and during the two generations over 200 cases were cured in the Moore family, in my grand father's generation, the family of 18, they had several cures but all were outside and coded by treated. and every member in that family, except one, had a paralytic stroke, comatose before death. and in that case paralytic conditions were present. The next generation ^{had} ⁱⁿ ^{it} ^{two} ^{cases} ^{of} ^{cancer} ^{but} ^{mostly} ^{were} ⁱⁿ ^{the} ^{stomach}. The next generation had most cancer on the liver, another uncle died with cancer on the stomach, two with ulcers on the stomach. In the present generation two young brothers have had cancer, one on the shoulder, and one on the back of the neck. I have had three, one on the joints of each thumb and one on the joint of the fore finger.

as we did not intend
or discover the remedy we should
not demand personal gain

of my right hand which I am now treating.

We were taught not to treat warts or corns owing to the soreness caused, unless they refused to go by other treatment. When a boy I had a number of warts on my hands and a wart remedy was bought at the drug store. The two on my thumbs refused to go with the wart remedy and the one on the knuckle of my fore finger all disappeared except a small whitening or poek. My father found the two on my thumbs were knit to the bone and he removed them with the cancer remedy. The poek on my finger remained inactive for twenty one years. Last fall it started to grow as a fine grained wart. Knowing its history I began the cancer treatment and found the whole joint full of cancer.

The theory has been strongly held that cancer was an organic growth. Live blood might be forced into dead tissue and become entrapped, and by losing its contact with vital life start a new body. If cancer, in that sense, were organic, removing the main body would kill the branches, which is not the case.

I have followed a new train of thought which implies that the only difference between inorganic and organic matter was its radium content. Radium is an activity a body takes on in an electric field or Sun light or both. Inorganic radium activity tends to break up all matter and reduce it to its lowest form, when matter gets a radium activity which tends to make its parts unite it becomes organic. When the particles unite a mutual activity is set up which tends to organized life. Hereditary perpetuates about 90% of life as it steps up in organization and radium in the air or food produces variation. Free radium is mostly taken in by breathing and as it travels in the blood through the body it blasts out the dead tissue by a series of explosions tight like lightning. When the dead tissue gets too heavy the life activity ceases in regard to organic material. When the body in general is healthy and a local part overloaded with dead tissue one of two things may happen to cause cancer. 1st The radium content of the healthy blood may raise the organic quality of the waste tissue or 2nd Waste material may continue to be thrown in the blood without being properly taken away and a fermentation start. A fermentation like yeast I believe the most probable cause in which cancer is a process and not a growth.

Remedy

The remedy (Moore's Chemical Radium) is an organic product, which for medicinal purposes can be used about ten times as strong as inorganic radium without destroying or killing the patient. It may be compared favorably with electric current, inorganic radium being high voltage and low amperage, organic radium being high amperage and low voltage. By a series of experiments a material was found which would produce a radium activity that when properly modified can be resisted by normal, healthy flesh yet will burn the body of the cancer. The roots undergo a chemical change and run out. Salves and

assistant remedies are used to help in the chemical change and to heal after the cancer is removed. It takes about three tons of the commercial product to produce an ounce and costs about £600 for the raw material beside the time or about £1000 an ounce. The market product is usually mixed with materials that will not mix with the modifiers as in some will set up a serious poisoning. As there is no key to its content after the first reduction, we produce from start to finish.

In a class at school in elementary Chemistry I asked my teacher about two products and he said they were the same. I asked him if a process were continued in a certain way what would happen. He said there would be no change. I knew I could continue it and if he did not know what to expect his hair would likely be grey next morning. So far we have had no accidents beyond losing a batch, but it is no playing process. Being a series of processes chemists have been unable to make anything of its analysis. It is a process that at present is unknown to general science and some of the opinion that inorganic radium such as is now in general use can be chemically produced. Some parts of the world have an unlimited supply of materials.

We had always been taught that it would not eat good flesh which was disputed by Dr. McLay. My brother made a few light cuts in his left arm and applied. The first dose made no effect. The second dose browned it, in the third dose his second finger was paralyzed and a big hole burnt in his arm. As he was treating a cancer at the same time, he closely observed the action of the medicine in the two cases. A piece of the medicine, which kept free from the action of the air, will burn a hole in good flesh like a piece of red hot iron dropped on a cake of ice yet the piece of medicine loses none of its weight or content. When applied to cancer under the same condition the medicine disappears. As it has a chemical affinity for cancer it does very little damage to good flesh when properly applied.

Last autumn my brother took a case which others tried to cure but failed. A doctor who uses a cancer plaster considered the case incurable. It was on the cheek. It started at about $\frac{1}{4}$ of the mouth up beside the nose nearly to the eye. Then around under the eye high on the cheek to in front of the ear, down in front of the ear to the lower jaw, along the lower jaw to the chin and up to the mouth. The bone in that area was entirely bare and came out nice and white except under the seat of the cancer where it was yellow. Three applications of the medicine caused the ^{yellow} bone to crumble leaving a hollow up under the eye. The cancer was entirely removed in Sept. and the place now healing. As the cancer was so large the patient was giving in under the pain. Cocaine was tried but had no effect in easing the pain, Morphine was then tried and worked very well for a couple of weeks when it lost its effect.

The discoverer treated as long as there was life and from his experience he deduced the following:
A cancer is incurable when a root has went through it

The action of the medicine on good flesh is almost painless.

a long hour and formed a second head. In the case of a Rose cancer when it has formed a second head in any part of the body it is incurable. On a woman's breast, when the nipple turns in it indicates the main body of the cancer is inside around the vital organs and is incurable. When a cancer has been cut its parts are not united and treatment very uncertain. A cancer in a joint should be very carefully treated and the modifying content of the remedy increased to prevent injuring the joint. Anesthetics during treatment retards good healing after the cancer is out.

In this case, the medical society representing the British Government do not know what they are getting and I have no real proposition to offer the family. If they would undertake a gentlemen's agreement not to analyze or allow anyone else to analyze or take or allow any to be taken for future analysis. I would go to Toronto General Hospital and treat a limited number of cases, if they chose any hospital in England. The doctors observing the cases to give me such help and information as I needed. If I went to Toronto my running expenses to be paid while there, if I went to England my transportation expenses to be advanced and running expenses ^{paid} while in England. They could choose the cases but the number to be limited to what could be treated with eight or ten ounces. The case my brother treated last fall took about an ounce, and seventy-five days treatment, not including Sunday's. An ounce will cure about ten cases the size of a bean, and takes about a month.

After they were satisfied as to the usefulness of the remedy we could talk a proposition, which I could offer the family. Owing to the spread of the disease and the change in the medical fraternity, outlook I am personally in favor of some change to give the public treatment, but I will not follow any course which the majority of the family consider questionable or dishonorable.

Dear Sir:

Cancer treatment, I understand, is of special interest to the University at present.

Our family has had a treatment for outside cancer through five generations and during that time over two hundred cancers in the family and several for outsiders have been removed.

My great, great grandfather was a medical officer in the British army in America. He was very friendly to the Indians and made a special study of their remedies. From them he learned very effective treatment for cancer and Bright's disease. We have lost the one for Bright's disease but owing to the prevalence of cancer in the family it has been kept.

I took out a large cancer for my brother about two years ago. Before treatment began it was examined by Dr. McBray Hamilton formerly Supt. Toronto General Hospital, and by Dr. McLay, Aylmer, Ont.

The medicine is also good for snake or dog bite or blood poisoning of any kind. In a snake or dog bite the it must be applied before the poison reaches the heart. The red streaks will recede as soon as the application is made and localize in a few minutes.

In poisoning from a rusty nail the most most severe pain can be relieved in from twenty to thirty minutes and the soreness gone in four to six hours.

A special grade will clean out bone corn or gangrene. The medicine is quite harmless to healthy flesh only it will dim the sight or irritate the mouth. It can be rubbed in the hands without injury but will immediately attack fevered or poisoned flesh. It will remove the false flesh in a wound in less time than a watch can tick and a small dose once every two or three days will cause it to heal very rapidly. In eating out a cancer it will leave the muscles, blood vessels and nerves clean if the cancer has not eaten them.

The secret has been handed down as a family past, each generation promising to keep the secret but treat anyone who came for treatment. As my father died when three of my brothers were very young they have learned the secret without swearing to the past and there seems to be a general family feeling the public should have a chance for treatment.

I understand you hold in trust, a large grant for a cancer cure. My plan is to give such reward to the Union University, Chungking China through the agency of the Canadian Methodist Church. They have the family sole manufacturing. After expenses and a stated salary had been paid all profits had been paid to go to the University in perpetuity through the church.

I spent four years as builder for the Canadian Methodist Mission in China and have had training as an Architect and Civil Engineer. I would organize the School

and look after the general interests of the venture.

I do not know what attitude the Church would take in assuming responsibility for such a business in perpetuity. There the family agreement would have to be developed which might not be easy. My father is the first in fourteen generations that did not at some time serve in the British army and I was in the last war before it was over. The family emigrated to Canada adl. Ch. and adherence to principle is very strong. If a body of investigators came to find out how it is made and offered the wealth of the Bank of England they would get the treatment of a German spy.

What I want to get is your feeling in the matter then submit a plan upon which the whole family would act. Corinth, Elgin Co Ontario is our old family home and you may have heard of us.

Dear Sir

I wrote to Lord Atholstan stating my experience re the cure of cancer and received in reply a printed form of his letter to you of the 23rd of last January, when writing I was quite aware of not being of those who were privileged of competing for the generous prize he has offered, on behalf of our common humanity it is my duty to explain how I suffered and was cured of cancer. I hope you will give the matter your gravest and most earnest consideration. About 1867 a small scumy spot appeared on the left side of my nose about half way up, as it was increasing I placed myself under medical treatment without avail this was in Liverpool, I then went to work in London while there I attended St Thomas's Hospital & still saw no improvement, my next move was to Holghed where I joined the Irish Mail Steamers as a junior Engineer my then Super^r took a great interest in my case, advised me to place myself under a Mrs Jones who was famous for curing cancer, I did so, and was perodentially cured by her treatment, this was in 1876.

While under treatment I saw a number of Mrs Jones's patients, she only failed in one case, the disease was too far advanced, ^{or cured} some of the cases were in the lip (men) hands chest back & breast of women before placing myself under Mrs Jones I introduced people whom she cured.

After being cured I determined to devote my life means to discover the cure, Mrs Jones died soon after my cure but I kept in close touch and friendship with her son until his death last year, his children spending their summer holidays here, as a reward for my gratitude he disclosed to me the means his mother used which was arsenic, I long suspected this but wanted his verification, I should have stated before attending Mrs Jones I was under the care of a Surgeon Napothier of Dublin he after some months treatment removed the growth, the operation was not successful as about three months afterwards the growth appeared again in a more alarming ~~manner~~ manner, the surgeon was very sympathetic in telling me the disease was cancer and regretted the operation was not successful, needless to describe my mental distress.

Directly after getting the cure from Mrs Jones I sent it on to the Lehelser research hospital run by Carl Ivagh, his son now Lord Eldredan took the matter up

the doctors in that institution evidently did not believe my story. I then wrote to the cancer research people stating my experience they merely acknowledged my letter, I partly expected this, as medical men & their works all condemn the use of "arsenic" as a cure for cancer, in my younger days there were several so called "quacks" practicing the cure of cancer with great success and a few failures, for which they were persecuted & prosecuted so much so, there are not any now practicing, in consequence the disease is spreading in our alarming way and the more suffer from that dreadful disease the more it will spread, it is infectious, the medical men all declare there is no cure, well there is a cure "arsenic" following is the treatment as given me by Dr. Jones as practiced by members of his family for generations.

The cancer to be scarified to draw blood, the wound to be sprinkled with "arsenic" so that the arsenic will be absorbed by the blood in the cancer, in a few hours the surrounding parts will be very much swollen and inflamed, then subside in a few days, in due course the cancer will drop out, if on the tongue or a wet place the treatment will have to be repeated every two or three days care to be taken not to swallow any spittle. If only roots remain after the cancer has

dropped out a little red precipitate powder
dropped on the roots will very likely rot them,
if not the arsenical treatment will have to be
repeated.

The treatment of cancer by arsenic is only
successful when applied in the early stages of the
disease before the cancer has become too deeply
rooted, as I am aware from inside information
arsenic has been tried in the cancer hospital London
but failed, the disease was too far advanced as I stated
before it is only in the early stages the treatment is
successful, the late Mrs Jones was very careful in
her selection of cases, her son states she cured hundreds
of people and from all parts of the world, I know of
cases that were sent to her by doctors.

I have done my utmost to try and get this cure
a fair trial, ~~as~~ the application of arsenic does not kill
even if the cancer is too advanced for its cure, it is a
positive cure ^{if used up time} I now make this appeal to you as a
man in a high position + personality, and in a new
country, whose new ideas have a reasonable chance
of being adopted and I presume in the name of our
common humanity ^{for you} to prevail on some of your young medical
students to take the matter into their hands for the
benefit of the human race.

No one has a greater respect for the medical profession than myself my life having been saved more than once by their skill, but you must be aware they have been very slow to adopt new ideas, especially when they come from lay men, inoculation to prevent small pox was in common use by country people before being adopted by the medical profession, in very recent years surgeons performed operations garbed in an old frock coat saturated with the germs of disease from many former operations, and until very lately consumption was not considered infectious, I just point out these cases to show that even doctors are liable to err, and they are making a grievous mistake in writing & preaching against the use of arsenic for the cure of ~~arsenic~~ ^{cancer}, it will take some one with gigantic energy & perseverance to overcome their opposition, surely some young medical men can be found to have the great moral courage to give this treatment a trial and so bring honour to himself and great benefit to the human race.

I sincerely hope my dear Sir you will not lightly put this letter aside as this will probably be the last effort for me to be able to make being in my 75th year and probably one of the last alive who have been cured or who have the moral courage to bring their case before a public board.

I originally did not send the cure to the different research hospitals for the sake of a reward, there was none offered, but simply for the benefit of our common humanity, when the doctor pronounced my disease "cancer" I was in robust manhood, keeping company with the "dearest girl in the world" but thank God I was cured, worked my way to Chief Engineer & now on pension, married the dearest girl and reared a family.

I hope you will answer this letter with the glad news that you will do your utmost to have the treatment tried you & everyone will be amazed at the simple cure.

I must add that the inflamed parts during treatment with some simple ointment in my case cocoa nut oil was used (this was before borax ointment was invented) also the wound was kept covered with lint the lint remained on the whole time of treatment.

With reference to Lord Atholstan's magnificent offer, I beg to submit to you a treatment for prevention and cure of Cancer.

I am the President physician in London since 1898, being a graduate of medicine at both Dartmouth Medical College, N.H. and Bellevue Medical College and Hospital, New York, where I practiced medicine prior to settling in London.

I was born at London, Ontario, Canada in 1848.

While on the staff of the New York Polyclinic College and Hospital, I had opportunity to test treatment for blood diseases, particularly syphilis with various forms and combinations of mercury, arsenic, etc, but I derived most benefit from the Bichloride of Mercury and I have intended to establish a clinic in the Cancer Hospital here, but on account of the War troubles I have been delayed until now this occasion opens up for your Canadian University to apply my treatment in Cancer there.

I will now write you my method in syphilis which is equally applicable to cancer:

I advise Blue Mass by pill or ~~injection~~ during the primary attack of ^{Chancres} ~~chronic~~ and glandular swelling, where, as secondary symptoms appear, hypodermic injections may be given of 1 half cubic centimeter in the soft part of the rump two successive nights and stop one night - continuing until the disease is controlled.

Afterwards administer mild doses of Potassium Iodide

well diluted with water one hour before breakfast and one
hour before supper for some weeks.

Kindly present my compliments to Lord Atholstan.
