Conditions of Award of Lord Athol-stan's \$100,000 Prize Offered for "Cure" More Fully Defined

Laymen were greatly interested and the medical profession greatly en-couraged nearly a year ago by the announcement through the press of the world that Lord Atholstan had offered a prize of \$100,000 to the

announcement through the press of the world that Lord Atholstan had offered a prize of \$100,000 to the graduate or student of any recognized university who, within five years, could discover a medicinal treatment for the effective cure of cancer.

Lord Atholstan's offer was made, so far as Canada was concerned, in a letter written on January 23, 1922, to Sir Arthur Currie, principal of McGill University, and since that time 2,715 claims for the prize have been made by residents of England, Scotland, Ireland, Wales, the United States, France, Italy, Belgium, Holland, Denmark, nearly every country in Europe, Asia, Africa and America. Practically every province in the Dominion of Canada has had its claimant. in the

claimant.

A circular has been issued explaining more fully the conditions of the award, in order that claimants may attempt to meet the demands more explicitly than heretofore. The decision of the award, it may be recalled, was left by Lord Atholstan to the Royal Colleges of Physicians and Surgeons, London, and the following extracts from a letter received by Lord Atholstan from that body have been quoted for the guidance of comclaimant.

3. Applicants who have satisfied the above conditions should request the medical faculty or medical society to report to the Imperial Cancer Research Fund.

Within a few days of the receipt of your letter (offering the prize of \$100,000) your cable offering another \$100,000 for cancer research was received, with the result that a special investigation is now being carried on with the funds you have so liberally placed at the disposal of the Imperial Cancer Research Fund.

I am the President physician in London since 1898, being a graduate of medicine at both Dartmouth Medical College, N.H. and Bellevue Medical College and Hospital, New York, where I practiced medicine prior to settling in London. I was born at London, Untario, Canada in 1848. While on the staff of the New York Polyclinic College and Hospital, I had opportunity to test treatment for blood diseases, particularly syphilies with various forms and combinations of mercury, arsenic, etc, but I derived most benefit from the Bichloride of Mercury and I have intended to establish a clinic in the Cancer Hospital here, but on account of the War troubles I have been delayed until now this occasion opens up for your Canadian University to apply my treatment in Cancer there. I will now write you my method in syphilles which is equally applicable to cancer: I advise Blue Mass by pill or intraction during the primary attack of chronic and glandular swelling, where, as secondary symptoms appear, hypodermic injections may be given of 1 half cubic centemeter in the soft part of the rump two successive nights and stop one night - continuing until the disease is controlled. Afterwards administer mild doses of Potassium Iodide

well diluted with water one hour before breakfast and one hour before supper for some weeks.
