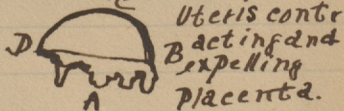
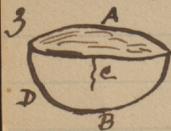


Diagram 1 represents the uterus in this case. The vom at A is caused by a clot of blood coming from the placenta at B and collecting to size of cricket

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ball at A. as being the  
point of least resistance.  
Had it been a simple  
fluid as water it might  
have oozed round to B  
and trickled down F.H.  
but as it could not get  
far without clotting, it  
collected at the least  
resistance. It escaped  
from the membranes  
becoming detached  
at I. The hemorrhage  
in this case emanated  
from the rupture of the  
membranes at J. In a

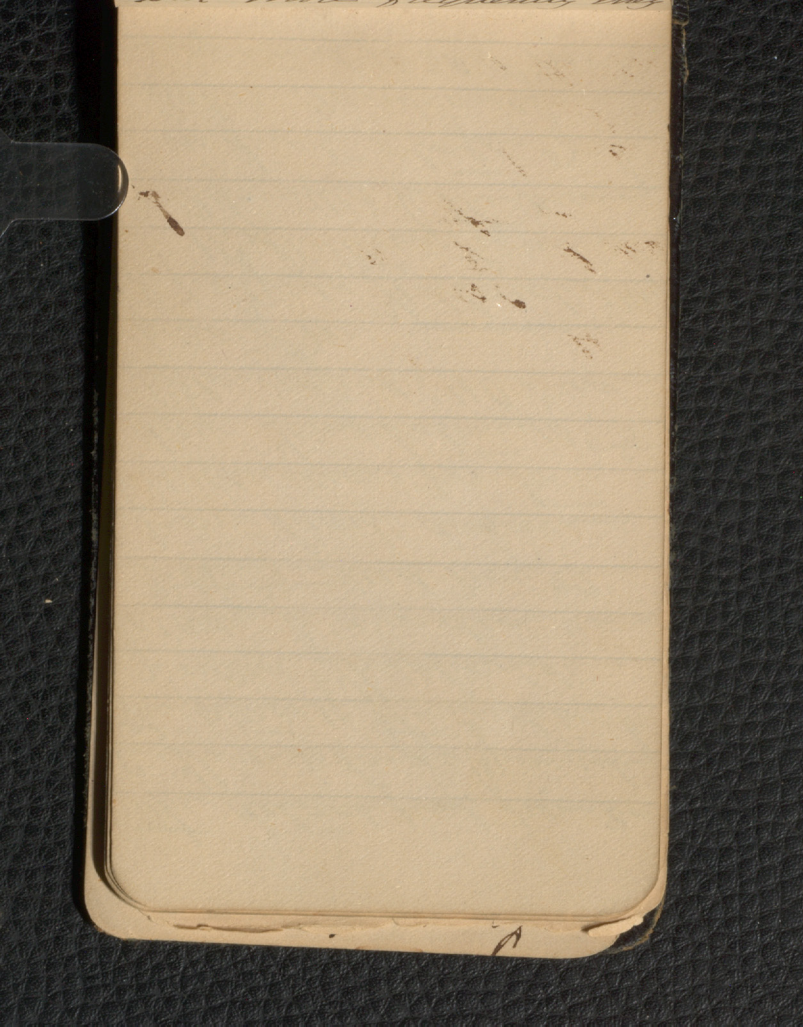

pass the finger gently  
up and by slight-pressure

will do so. Keep up firm  
friction at B. Figure 24
