King Defender of the Faith To all to whom these Presents shall come Greeting:

Know ye that we of our especial grace certain knowledge and mere motion have given and granted
and by these presents do give and grant unto our trusty and well beloved William Osler,
Esquire Fellow of the Royal Society Doctor of Science the Reading and Office and place of the Reader in
the Science and Faculty of Physic for the use and improvement of the English Youth in our
University of Oxford for the time being And him the said William Osler Reader or Instructor in the
Science and Faculty aforesaid in the same University we do by these presents make ordain and constitute
the same being void by the resignation of Sir John Scott Burdon-Sanderson Baronet to have hold
exercise and enjoy the Reading Office and place aforesaid to him the said William Osler by himself or
by his sufficient Deputy in that behalf for and during our pleasure together with all fees profits
privileges and advantages thereto belonging in as ample manner as any of the holders of the said
Office have held and enjoyed or of right ought to have held and enjoyed but subject nevertheless
to such regulations as the said University may make from time to time by Statute under the
provisions of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act 1877. At witness whereof we have
caused these our Letters to be made Patent. Witness Ourself at Westminster the tenth
day of October in the fourth year of our reign.
