Dear Sir William,

Your letter of 31st ultime has only just reached me, and I will not fail to bring its contents to the notice of the important members of the Peace Conference, whom I am to meet to-morrow.

Professor Tendeloo is undoubtedly a very prominent Dutch physician, and anything coming from him calls for serious attention.

I agree that if the Germans were called upon to deliver cattle and milkcows under present circumstances, it would increase their mortality, but I do not agree with him that revolution would also become inevitable in Allied countries.

I was exceedingly pleased to have met you at Oxford, and am, dear Sir William. Sincerely yours.
