Dear C

I was afraid there would be trouble at N.Y. about an outsider. They are more likely to nab you at Boston, but there too they are tied and bound. Meanwhile you should be reasonably happy where you are & from all I hear you are getting the neurologs of the county by the filum terminale. Dana is most enthusiastic about you. We want you at the Charaka Club - have they told you? We had a splendid passage, 5 d 11 hrs. Such a mess here! Workmen everywhere, but when they get out we shall have a very complete house. We have had a cold spell which came just in time to test our new furnace & the hot water. Your letter this am about the picture is most interesting. I am glad there was a formal presentation, and that the general verdict was favorable. I have sent my Marburg remarks to Norton. I looked up Warrington & added something about Aiken & Priestly who must have been the moving spirits of the place. I am so sorry not to have met Randy & had a chat about the books. That is a myth as to the rarity of the English *trans.* of the *de generatone*. It is not a rare book at all. One day it was sold unfortunately for L40. with the statement that most of the copies had been burnt in the gt fire but Payne tells me there is no foundation whatever for this.
