Dear H.C./

What do you think of geography in the civil service examination? That is the question we are debating at present in this august body. Not always interesting but a very interesting body of men. I am getting an education. I was glad to have your nice long letter, I do hope that something may come out of the Harvard matter. You should be very happy there, if they gave you a free hand. The house is still chaotic - painters everywhere but it is for the last coat. My library will be very nice in oak -pannelled. My treasures are still in boxes. A few at Ch Ch & at the ~~Museum~~. It will be a great comfort to have them all together again. I am not doing much on the auction room, but I think told you that I bought a fine 17th century very early Religio Medici MS - I pick up an occasional book. Yesterday Coste lecture in latin 1782 at Williamburg Va on the Ancient learning adapted to the new world.
