(To A.C. Klebs) ...Yes we could easily get you a photograph of the Paracelsus portrait in the Bodleian; I will make application at once. Are you sure there is not anywhere in Germany a national monument to Ulrich von Hutten? There surely must be! [There seems to be only one bas-relief medal of Hutten on the monument of the reformation in Worms. K. discovered it sometime later and sent photos of it to W.O.] He was really the inaugurator of German unity and the very incarnation of the Teutonic spirit. I have always had the greatest admiration for him, and as a factor in the Reformation he certainly comes next to Luther and Erasmus.

I should think one of Nuttall's men at Cambridge could make a report on insects - or possibly Nuttall himself might go out. [Internat. Congress Hygiene, Washington, K. as vice-chairman of a section sent out invitations for that congress. Nuttall made the report]...
