Dear Cushing,

I have sent word at once asking Keovigh to let you have letters to Sloggett and the English surgical consultants. It would be very advantageous if you knew personally the conditions. The idea is to have a complete unit as far as the surgeons, consulting physician, consulting surgeon, ophthalmic surgeon, and special numbers, to take charge of a hospital of 1,040 beds, so that you see that it is a pretty big contract. The subordinates will be managed from the War Office here.

Mrs. Chapin is at present away on a brief visit, but Grace will no doubt wire you about the change to the "Lusitania".
