S. - It seems years since we saw you and I seem to be doing absolutely nothing for you - I am sure you are busy - I hear the conditions at the C. C. Ss. is much improved by the valuable men who have been sent up - and I am taking a little credit for our very own men. Revere was safe on the 14th. How awful you would feel if you saw him with a bad head wound - but what a mercy it would be for him. The anticipated horror is very wearing I must say. He is near St. Julien I believe - One of his men passed through McGill & Billy Francis saw him and his Captain is in Hospital in London.

I hope the pyjamas were quite what you wanted & the sleeping socks keeping your toes warm. I wonder if you will come to England for your leave - England meaning Oxford? We hope Revere will get leave the end of September. Susan is talking of going home and I feel it would be wrong to hinder her.

It will be an anxious time when it comes but do not believe the danger is so great on the outgoing ships. I feel that Sue should go home - John might be called up & she should be there - although I think he is far down on the list. Last Tuesday we went down to Orpington to see Tom McCrae - It is an enormous Hospital - 2080 beds. Tom has got his wards well organized & is very content. He hopes to stay until Oct 1st and Tom Futchter will succeed him - The Futchers have a daughter by the way, and are much pleased. Phoebe Wright has gone as a V A D to No. 7 Canadian general near you - Do see her some day. She is quite a fascinating person.
