So glad of your letter this morning! I have wired Revere's address as far as I know it. His C.O. has changed & I do not know his name, could not wire it if I did. I have an idea R<sup>H</sup> is beyond ~~-----~~ [deleted by Censor] - he might get to you for a day on his horse. . . Sue means to go the end of next month I think - do not say anything to Kate about it for she does not want the family to know.

Tom McCrae may go then & he would be a stalwart companion. Tom Fatcher sails this week. We hope R- gets leave in September. Will you come to us for your leave? I am afraid it will not come yet. Sue will take your diary in her pouch if you have it sent here - of course we must read it first - you won't mind. <sup>H</sup>R- was all right on the 23rd taking two quiet (?) days <sup>W</sup>with a gas whiff inside. What a life you must be leading! we are nearly drowned here & blown out of bed. I must send you a warm jersey to sleep in later.
