Dear Harvey

I hope the various letters have reached you - We heard that you had been at Camiers and were going back - in fact we had your letter from there. Each day the tie drawing you to us seems closer - We have been at Corfe Castle and I have at home a dear little picture you enlarged - of Revere fishing up the mound there - you after him - and I remember our tea there - then all our wonderful life at 1 & 3 W. Franklin St, with your teas with Revere and frolics in the nursery. Every detail we seem to be living on now - and then the end - with you by his side - I never cease rejoicing at that - and all the kind surgeons who have written - & some of our own Oxford sisters at 61 C.C.S. who have written, one of going to his grave, etc. Perhaps you will find out while up there the name & address of the orderly who looks after the grave - and if you can suggest anything further that can be done - let me know. We have been here ten days and will be at home Saturday - Sir William is sleeping better and I think will be all right but his heart is broken and he cannot cease weeping - poor darling it is so cruel - for his later life - Will you come to England for your leave? Susan is wonderful - & such a comfort. The question of her going home is in abeyance as she may get some work with the Army in France. She has gone to see Mr. Endicott of the Red Cross who is in London.
