Dear Harvey

We were glad to hear from you this morning back at your Hospital - I do so dread the winter for you and am afraid you will be frozen. I am sending off a warm jersey for you to sleep in and do let me know if you want heavier pyjamas. We hear Malcom Peabody is over again and will come tomorrow to stay with Mrs. Draper, so we shall hear more of you - At 61 C.C.S. are two Oxford Sisters - Jones & McClosky who write me constantly about Revere's grave and go there. They take a great interest. The Battery put a brass cross on the wooden one and the Major wrote that the men had put "nose-caps" around - The sisters of course did not know who had done this and took them away. I wrote them to put them back as I did not want to hurt the Batteries' feelings - they have been so wonderfully kind. So you will understand. We are all well. Sue is going to London next Wednesday as Chairman of the Red Cross Distributing Department - "Temporarily". They have cabled Joe Warren to come to take charge of it - Later I am sure she wants to go to France. Major Osgood spent last Sunday with us & suggested Sue might take charge of a V. A. D. Hospital in France. At any rate she is staying over. John Chapin & all the family urge her doing so. T. B. F. is wonderfully happy at Orpington & J. McC has reached home.

We are fighting on - and doing our best.
