Dear Harvey

We have been hoping to hear you were coming on leave. I have a horrible idea you may have gone to Paris instead . Whenever you come it will be a joy to see you and have you with us for as long as you can stay. I hope you have your new quarters comfortably settled. Phoebe Wright wrote with pleasure of seeing you. I had an enchanting letter from your Kate a day or two ago and am just ready to write her. I think so, so much of her and know how desolate she must be. Susan is magnificent. She has the Red Cross Receiving & Distributing place well in hand and is working like a slave - She lives at Brown's Hotel and has Dr. Osgood and the other young Americans constantly at dinner. She comes home Saturday and seems very happy. We are working along and doing what we can. Sir William is deep in the Catalogue. He looks very thin & badly but has a good appetite & sleeps well now - so I cannot hope for anything more - If you think of it when you write - or ask your secretary to tell me the name of Mrs. McMonagle's Hotel - I have lost her letter and address, but have written of course since her tragedy. The Orthopedes are having a vicious time here with the Administration and Sir Robert Jones comes tomorrow to try to help them. Dr. Osgood is coming here on Saturday on his way from Liverpool, from a neurological something.

Revere's kit has never come but Cox says it is all right and will come. Major Batchelor is still in England.
