Think of Loch Inver and the happy people we were then -Jack got turned down then by Nonas but always has hoped she would relent and I believe would have - but I do not think she really loved him. This is another name to our ever increasing list and I dread to think of the spring.

Before Christmas I sent by Dr. Osgood a small parcel to Phoebe Wright with a Christmas present for her and a fishing photo of Revere for you. Phoebe never got it - the parcel. Osgood took ill and to this day we have never found out exactly where he is. Do ask him if you see him if he ever got the parcel from Mr. Endicott in London.

Susan is in uniform and looks about 18 - & very slight. She is splendid & likes her work so much. I hear that she is becoming invaluable to the Red Cross. We like Thaxter & Van Sader so much - they are in our Hospital & very cheery -
