Dearest Kate

These wonderful pictures have just come from Major Fiaschi from an Australian Hospital in Boulogne. He - Fiaschi was once in Baltimore from Australia as a P. G. Perhaps you remember him - we often see him. He says he has sent some pictures to Dr. Cullen. We are all thrilled over Phoebe Wright's engagement to Reggie Fitz. I had heard Emmons and was not surprised. He has won a prize and so has she from what I hear. I hope you will say all you can of the Wright family among our Boston friends & say how lovely Mrs. Wright is - of course they are much excited as they have never seen Fitz. And Phoebe seems so madly in love with him. We are hoping they get leave to come over together but at the moment the strain is so intense and everything so urgent one hardly thinks they can leave - every man & woman must be at his or her post and keep at it just as hard as possible. I wrote a long letter to Mrs. Fitz and told her all I could about the Wrights. Sue is here for Sunday - very well but almost too thin. I am thankful she will have a few days rest over Easter. If John is called up I am convinced it would be foolish for Sue to go home - she had much better stick it out here and get moved to France when he comes over - that's what I shall say to her when the time comes. My father had an expression he used to use when anything went wrong - when he hammered his thumb or some one stepped on his toe - "Hell - damnation & scissors" - and that's the way I feel now about the War.
