I hope your real Valentine has reached you today and that the happy family is once more united, I feel so, so glad for you to think Harvey has gone home and trust he will never have to leave you again. I always have loved him - but since his being with Revere I feel nearer than ever to him - We so enjoyed having him here and it was too bad he couldn't get here sooner - but he seemed in better shape every day and I trust the voyage did the finishing touches. Thank God he is alive. Just after Harvey sailed this telegram came - I sent a wire to Strong in Paris to tell him Harvey had sailed yesterday - Gen McCaw. Gen McCaw was here and he said Mr. Davison had asked him to let him have Harvey - but as he had already started he thought he better not be called back for the Red +. Sue is winding up her work and I shall keep her to rest as long as possible and to see the spring - We are having bitter weather and skating. Mrs Wright & the girls - or Marion rather - sail next week - Phoebe is waiting for Reggie - Jean has her husband and is near the Camp - Dearest love to you all.
