Dear Cushing:

I sent your letter on to Spielmann: just had his reply. The Press ask for a subsidy of \$500. If 250 copies are printed and 200 sold at 10 dollars - or really 15 dollars we could ask - there would not be much loss. This does not look much for the Press to do but the delagates are feeling very low in their mind financially as wages are getting higher, paper still dear, and arrears of printing very heavy.

So glad to hear you are better. It's interesting to see about the outbreak of encephalitis in America. I hope they will be able soon to determine its relations to the peripheral neuritis and to Heine-Medin.

We have the Classical Association here this week at which I am blowing off steam as President. I will send you an early copy of my address.
