Well-Known Resident of Dundas Passed Away To-day

Mrs. H. C. Gwyn, wife of Colonel H. C. Gwyn, and daughter of Rev. Featherston Lake Osler, died at the Wentworth Arms this morning.

The late Mrs. Gwyn was an exceptionally highly cultured lady and a charming conversationalist. During her life she had endeared herself to a large circle of friends through her lovable disposition.

She was born in Bond Head, county of Simcoe, in 1847, and had resided in Dundas practically since 1857, moving to this city but a few months ago. The estate in Dundas was known as Staplehurst.

Deceased was a sister of the late Sir Edmund Osler, prominent financier of Toronto; the late B. B. Osler, famous criminal lawyer; the late Sir William Osler, of Oxford, England, and Honorable Mr. Featherston Osler, late of the Ontario court of appeal, Toronto.

Surviving, besides her husband, are four sons, Rev. Herbert B. Gwyn, of Chicago; Dr. Norman Gwyn, of Toronto; Trevor, of Winnipeg and Major Gwyn, in India; four daughters, Mrs. Elmon Abbott, of Baltimore; Mrs. Thomas McCrae, of Philadelphia; Mrs. Britton Osler, of Toronto, and Mrs. Cecil Stuart, of Toronto; and one brother, Francis, of England. One son, Major Charles Campbell Gwyn, was killed at Vimy Ridge, April 7, 1917.

The funeral service will be held on Wednesday afternoon, at 2.45 o'clock in St. James church, Dundas. Interment will be made in Grove cemetery, Dundas.
