V. Y. Bowditch sent me these volumes in May '08. I asked him for a book from his father's collection with his name in it to put in the best of company in my shelves. H. I. Bowditch impressed me as one of the best of men. When I went to Boston in 1875 to look up the subject of hæmorrhagic small-pox I took a letter of introduction from Dr. Howard, and I spent a memorable evening with him. He was full of enthusiasm for his old teacher Louis, whose biography he had recently written. When giving me a bundle of reprints and saying goodbye at the door he remarked "You are a young fellow just coming on the slate, I am going off. Take my advice and have a reprint of everything you write and collect them. I would give \$1000 for a set of all my papers". This made a great impression on me and I have followed his advice. Through him I became friends with his nephew H. P. and his son V. Y. Wm. Osler.

One day at the Press in the Secretary's room my eye lighted on a fine folio in the bookcase and to my surprise and delight I found it was Lister's *Historia Conchyliorum*, the 3rd ed., edited by Mr. Dillwyn. The 2nd ed. was also issued by the Oxford Press; the first was published by the author. The plates were in the Asmolean collection, and were used in the 2nd and 3rd eds. Mr. Chapman had this copy bound for me. Curiously enough, two days before it was sent home, Dr. Payne came from London to spend a couple of days, and brought me Parts i and ii of the 1st ed.

The Mr. Dillwyn who edited this edition was an old and helpful friend of my uncle Edward. Dillwyn it was who induced him to go to the West Indies on a conchological expedition, and who presented his monographs on Burrowing and Boring Marine Animals (nos. 244-25) before the Royal Society.
