Dearest Sister

In the Library - Jason Mixter having dinner here And going to town at 9.25-& sails tomorrow. I am sending a Cable now as I think you must be safe except in the usual dangers of the sea. The Nebraskan finished me. And even Willie has been worried, He went into the town twice last eve to see the posters. Your letter from Liverpool was a Comfort. I nearly died in the Station but perhaps it was better having the others there Adèle wanted to join me but I really Couldnt - I rushed to Liberty's, got some China - then to Harrods for Reverses things And to Evans for odds and Ends - & to the Station; Met Bill. We had sandwiches On the train - although as an officer he couldn't ride in my compartment. The thermometer must have been 80°. I went to the workroom And helped Mrs Thomson. I found there had been 8 men from Cliveden at luncheon - and found several others at tea on the Terrace - & Bob for dinner - Goodness - it was awful when I went upstairs And looked at your room - Yesterday And today have been cool & glorious - Henry has Everything planted now. Every one was asking for you At the workroom & regretted your departure. I have engaged a Chauffeur who comes tomorrow -

This is a hurried line to go by Jason who will post it on the ship. Bob has just come in And says the Servian thing has probably fallen through - he has been in London today.
