They are quite right - these professors should brush the streets if Nothing better turns up - At least I'll do that rather than take a Belgian family to live - By tomorrow or Friday you'll hear of our fire - Every one thinks it wonderful I stood the shock so well. The joy of having Willies books saved would keep one up if nothing Else. He stood the shock too - or rather went back to bed when the flames were out - It has taken all the week to get Estimates & Matters Arranged for the Insurance people - They let us go on with the sitting room & I hope to be back there by next week, & books put back - The other will be months. We like the little dining room - The two big Magazine tables are in the drawing room. McGill Hospital has to move Their tents blew down in a recent storm and they are short 300 beds. They are packed and ready to go. Revere was still there Saturday but ready to move any moment. Jack Slessor gone to Egypt in the flying Corps. I heard his officer said he was born an Aviator -I see Norman Prince has turned up - You never saw such a dear as Jack. Did I tell you he chased the big Zep in the last London Raid & had 4 bombs to drop? What changes for Revere And Jack !: Harvey C- wrote about the Harvard Unit And now Mr Lowell has sent a long letter. W.O has gone to town to see the War Office about them.
