Dear Dr. White

W.O and I feel so grieved that you are ill and suffering - I wish we had not let you go home last summer but had insisted on Mrs. White coming over - We might have had such a happy winter here and you would not have done any foolish tricks on the ship to strain your back. I do sincerely hope that the warm weather will do you good and that warm sunshine on your own veranda will relieve the pain. We are all well. W. O has just got over a bad cold and I have made him be very careful. We have had 6 weeks of the most ghastly weather and still have it very cold. At the moment we have Revere at home - He is getting out of the Canadian Corps and entering the Royal Artillery. This will keep him in England for several months in training - And after that we must make up our minds to have him sacrificed if necessary - I pray he may be spared for his father's sake - Our best love to you both and may you soon be well -
