I am so glad you are going or have gone on the trip - I hope you have fine weather & enjoy every moment - Harvey C- is such fun when off on a holiday - I wish I was along - We have just heard that the Baldwin girl who was on the Sussex - is very bad. They are at Wimereux just out of Boulogne. It seems so terrible. We had tea with them Thursday afternoon & Willie joked with the girl so merrily - and the next day by noon she was as good as dead - Mr Penfield the Rhodes Scholar who was on the Sussex - & his leg fractured, is coming to us from Dover as soon as he can move -
