Dear Sir,

The records of the Almshouses at Ewelme, about which you wrote to this Office on 9th. August, are described in Appendices to the Eighth and Ninth Reports of the Historical Manuscripts Commissions, the former new being out of print. But as they were published respectively in 1881 and 1883, they must almost certainly have been known to Sir William Osler when he put his Muniment Room in order in 1906. There are, of course, numerous sporadic references to Ewelme in the Public Records but, so far as I know, the Almshouses have received no special attention from the Historical Manuscripts Commission during recent years.
