THE present Post-Graduate Course is continuing until the end of September, and new members are being enrolled from day to day. This week, however, terminates the period of study of a considerable body of our students. The American Medical Post-Graduates leave London for home within the next few days, and the occasion calls for special commemoration. The following messages to our departing Students have been received for publication in the "Bulletin."

From Sir William Osler, Br., Regius Professor of Medicine, University of Oxford; Chairman of the Council, Fellowship of Medicine.

"Greetings and best wishes to American members of our Fellowship. Bon voyage."

From Surgeon Rear Admiral Sir Humphry Rolleston, K.C.B., President of the Royal Society of Medicine, and Chairman of the Emergency Post-Graduate Committee of the Fellowship of Medicine.

"In congratulating you on your approaching return to your own country I would like to express the pleasure your presence here has given us, and to hope it is au revoir only, and that when you visit us again we may get to know each other still better."

From Colonel F. F. Longley, M.C., U.S.A., Officer Commanding the American Students' Detatchments in British Universities.

"Sincere thanks are due to the Fellowship of Medicine from all the United States Army Medical Students and from myself, as their administrative head, for all the advantages and kindnesses that they have received through activities of the Fellowship of Medicine. I believe that the vast majority of the American medical men do not know that London holds such an alluring variety of excellent opportunities for medical work. I know that the several hundred medical students belonging to this detachment did not know this before they came here in March. Those students do know it now. They know also the kindly, sincere good feeling; the ardent desire to share their knowledge and their facilities that have been shown by the medical men of Britain, during their period of study just ending here, and they know too the unlimited benefits that can result from a close co-operation between the medical men of the United States and of the United Kingdom. "I am an optimist, and was told so when (on the suggestion of Sir Arbuthnot Lane) I summoned a meeting last Christmas Eve to discuss the possibility of immediately organizing an Emergency Post-Graduate Course for the benefit of young medical officers returning from the war-but with all my optimism I could not have believed that it would prove to be such a success. The twelve great medical schools of London had never before worked together -but from the start, when they knew that here was an opportunity of showing their appreciation of the never-to-be-forgotten services of their American and Dominions confrères, they vied with each other to make the scheme a success, and that is the greatest of all possible rewards. My only regret is that working 'at the hub' gave me so few opportunities of making the personal acquaintance of the 'Boys' but from my heart I wish them Godspeed, and that they will come and see us again. They will always be welcome."

"For many years I have been striving to promote good feeling and fellowship between the medical men of the two great English speaking nations, and it has been a sincere pleasure to have had the opportunity of welcoming so many of our colleagues from across the sea on their return from the fight for freedom and justice."

The American Post-Graduates were the first to join the Course at the express desire of their Army Authorities. Their stay in London has resulted in the warmest feeling of friendship and cameraderie among their fellow students, who deeply regret their departure. The membership still includes many representatives of the Overseas Dominions, and of our own Naval and Military Medical Services. The Fellowship will always remember with pride that in its first organized activity it was able to bring together in medical study members of the English-speaking races from all quarters of the globe. One of the great objects of its foundation has thus been attained, and this initial success will spur it on to further endeavour.


