To Dr. Knopf from Dr. Flick Philadephia, Pa., Dec. 11, 1903. Dear Dr. Knopf: Your letter of 10th inst. to hand. On the question of the Tuberculosis Congress, I may offer to say this: 1st, that I would not be willing to under any circumstances to be associated with either of the two Congresses now in process of organization; 2nd, that an American Congress on Tuberculosis ought to be in thehands of men who have done tuberculosis work; 3rd, that Dr. Trudeau is conspicuously the man who ought to be President of such a Congress; and 4th, that in recognition of Mr. Phipps's generosity in furthering the Tuberculosis cuase the Congress on Tuberculosis ought to be held in Philadelphia unless for good and sufficient reasons it be held in St. Louis, Sincerely yours, Lawrence F.
