My dear Dr. Osler:

Dr. Ravenel has informed me that the committee the other night adopted the resolution which I had made with the amendments which had been presented before I left. As Professor Maragliano will be in this country during the latter part of this month it has occurred to me that it might be a good plan to hold the meeting sometime near the date of his lecture so as to give the Western men an opportunity of attending the lecture at the same time that they come to the meeting. The date of Maragliano's lecture will be either the 28th or 31st of March. Perhaps it also might be a good plan to hold the meeting in Philadelphia, and if this is deemed the proper thing to do we shall be glad to provide the hall here at our expense. Inasmuch as entertainment will be given to Prof. Maragliano the same entertainment will perhaps answer for the delegates.
