IN any estimate of the causes that have assisted in establishing the eminence of Dr. Osler as a teacher of medicine, no one factor can be given greater prominence than his own individuality. No textbook however valuable and widely read can reproduce the charm and stimulus and suggestiveness of extemporaneous bed-side teaching. The indefinable point of view, the little quirk of expression that fastens a concept or a generalization in the mind of the hearer, without any conscious effort of retention on the latter's part, are ill-suited to the pages of a formal treatise.

In this opinion, the editors have, for some years past, been compiling the concise expressions—clinical aphorisms, medical *obiter dicta*—that have fallen from Dr. Osler's lips in his ward rounds in the Johns Hopkins Hospital. Knowing from their own experience as students and in practice the inestimable value of such a note-book, as a supplement and clarifier to the more ponderous textbooks of Medicine, they have prepared the present collection. Its best description lies in its title—“Oslerisms”; it is the expression of a great teaching mentality in its own unhampered manner, lacking the formality of a systematic treatise, free, direct, and intimate.

An interleaved edition is being prepared for medical students, to enable them to note and compare the opinions of their own teachers, as expressed *viva voce* in the freedom of the general clinic.
