

Taken from "Medical Libraries" Published in *Denver* 1898 and 1899

When "Medical Libraries" was organized to "encourage the founding of Medical Departments in all Public libraries wherever the medical profession was fairly organized", Dr. Osler showed his interest in the movement (in 1898) and wrote the editor and publisher, Dr. C.D. Spivak of Denver:

"How is your journal getting on? Please put me down as a subscriber.

In 1899 when Dr. Samuel A. Fisk, of Denver, conceived the idea of the Medical Libraries Fund, Dr. Osler responded:

"Dear Doctor Fisk:

Yes, with pleasure, and I enclose a check for ten dollars. Let me know at any time should there be difficulties and I would give an additional subscription. The publication is one which deserves the active support of the profession.
