THE Bishop of Ripon, Dr. Thomas Banks Strong (who has been appointed Bishop of Oxford), is the author of Historical Christianity the Religion of Human Life, Religion, Philosophy, and History, The Gospel of the Creed, Eucharistic Doctrine, and The Place of Scripture in the Church in Ancient and Modern Times. He edited Origins of Christianity (Bigg), Lectures on the Method of Science; with Dr. Sanday he selected the hymns for the Oxford Hymn Book, and contributed a preface to Arkwright's Catalogue of Music in the Library of Christ Church, Oxford.

Dr. Strong for nineteen years, before he went to Ripon in 1920, was Dean of Christ Church; he was Vice-Chancellor of the University from 1913 to 1917, and has served

as a Delegate of the Press for twenty years, being appointed in 1905.

CAPTAIN GEORGE HEYES, who died on June 16, aged 56, was the latest translator of Villon, his *Retrospect of François Villon* having been published at the end of last year.
