THIS is a big book, but the subject is multifarious. Osler's life is a part of the history of three countries—Canada, the United States, and Great Britain. His influence pervaded the whole of the English-speaking world. His name was a talisman wherever medicine was taught, studied, or practised. The variety of his interests, and his enormous powers of work, made his life a kaleidoscope of public activity; and the materials for his history, in his own letters and writings, and in the letters and recollections of his friends, are immense. His biographer's greatest difficulty has been so to select from this mass that the salient features of Osler's life and character shall stand out. It is believed that he will be found to have succeeded.
