Dear Sir William Osler,

I am interested to hear that Dr. Saleed has been to see you.

I am all for repairing the tomb of Avicenna. Funk will I am sure tell you all about it. If a fund is started, I would be glad to help in any way possible. Perhaps Funk, Sa'eed and myself might form the nucleus of a local Committee to administer the money - and it would be politic to have one or two other native physicians - Mussulmans - as Sa'eed is a convert. Only the other day I decided to write a short illustrated paper for the Barts journal re my first visit to Hamadan with particular reference to the tomb of Avicenna. Do you think this would be a good way of opening the ball? It would be read by many and perhaps noticed in the medical journals.

I have friends at Hamadan, but Funk would be able to form a very good estimate of the cost.

I will look out for early MSS.

Sa'eed is most intelligent and well-read as you will have discovered. He is also the best native physician I have met. I greatly regret his having left Tehran.

Please remember me to Dr. Garrod when you see him.
