Dear Dr. Cushing -

Enclosed are our series of letters from Sir William.

They were written to me while I was at Trier with the Army of occupation & he put me on the track of Cusanus (21 II 19) and I followed it up, sending him books and photographs, etc. as I found things. He had a section of Dr. Stalici's *Experimentis* translated in London for me from one of his own ed. prin.

It is interesting to note how enthusiastic he was over anything I found, - none notes from him on this subject alone during the year 1919. Even in bed (16 XI 19) he kept his interest: - "I am better - still in bed & still coughing!". He must have recognized in middle November the significance of that cough.

I am writing a note on Cusanus to go with the translation of the "*Stalici's Experimentis*" - This small series of letters may be of some value to you. They certainly show many of his finest qualities.
