My dear Doctor Cushing:

Since I wrote you I have had the very marked pleasure of spending some time at Murray Bay and have met a number of Sir William Oslers' and your friends. I have spent the last three days with Bill Darrach who has told me a good deal more about what happened over seas. I want you to know that I think it is wonderful that you have kept your own name out of the book.

I dislike to in any way trouble you but you can be of quite a good deal of help to me. As I think I told you I am greatly interested in the development of the dental side of the Presbyterian here, we have just installed our first Dental Interne, who happens to be Doctor Arthur P. Connolly of Brookline, who graduated from Harvard Dental this year.
