I wonder if you know that the W. H. Ochsner, who is mentioned with so much feeling by Csler, following his death from typhoid at the Johns Hopkins Hospital, was one of my students.

I fitted him for Hopkins; and during his senior year at Wisconsin he was my laboratory assistant.

I wrote a short sketch of him for the March issue of the Wisconsin Alumni Magazine, 1910.

I do not know that Csler was aware that Cchsner was a direct descendant of the Cchsner whose daughter married Wilhelm von Hohenheim, and so became the mother of Paracelsus.

A cousin of W. H. Cchsner, another of my students, is the present Professor of Surgery here at Wisconsin.

Keep your eye on the various issues of the Annals of Medical History during the next year, and see how active my Seminar has become.
