

Albumen is increased to about 50% per  
volume. Edema of face, hands & feet  
is increased, skin very moist & cool.  
M temp 100 1/5. Resolution of pneumonia  
is going on nicely. A warm poultice  
was ordered for the right lumbar  
region.

June 18<sup>th</sup> the pulse poorly today & slow, skin  
moist. Edema unchanged. Urine is  
less, being only 14 oz for the last 24 hours.  
Sept 10<sup>th</sup>. Large casts are found, and  
are dark in color. Some waxy looking  
ones are also found. Urine is very acid  
today. He underwent an ophthalmoscopic  
examination today when the following  
state was made out. "Ophthalmoscopic  
appearances of both retina are characteristic  
of Retinitis Albuminica. At Macula  
there is in each a collection of small almost  
lustrous white spots having a somewhat  
stellate arrangement and occupying  
an area about the size of the optic papilla  
A number of similar spots are also present  
in the neighborhood of the optic nerve.

around which for some little distance  
the retina appears somewhat swollen  
and opaque. The retinal arteries are  
thick rather swollen than normal, the  
retinal veins are of normal size but  
rather lustrous. The optic papilla is  
slightly paler than usual in a state  
of health. There is only one blood stain  
visible on the retina, situated a short  
distance below the N. optic nerve and  
of quite small size. The white spots  
or infiltrations in the retina are not  
as numerous or as large as we often  
meet with in Retinitis Albuminosa,  
possibly because the disease of the retina  
is not of long duration, if so they may  
be expected to increase both in size and  
number. "

June 19. Pupils very slow in <sup>regain</sup> their normal condition after the use of the atropine

He looks bright today. Amt of urine 62 oz. Sp. gr. 1010. + 25% of albumen. No change in oedema.

June 20. Amt of urine 94 oz. Sp. gr. 1020. Oedema less today. Patient feels sleepy

June 21<sup>st</sup> He expresses himself as feeling well today. Urine 113 oz. Sp. gr. 1008 Albumen 10%. Is clear + gives little deposit on standing. Temp M. 99.7/10. Pulse steady + fairly full. R 24. Drains are doing admirably.

June 22. Amt of urine 110 oz. Sp. gr. 1020 a few short fragments of reniformular casts were found. but are hard to get today. Skin is moist + cool. He feels well, + looks bright. Temp is normal.

June 24 Amt of urine 135 oz. Oedema of face + left hand increased. The right hand + feet are almost free from it. The effusion into the abdomen + scrotum much less. Drains are clearing up steadily.

June 25. Patient feels very comfortable today  
appetite good. Skin cool + moist. Amt  
of urine 132 oz. Acid. Sp. Gr. 1008, a trace  
of albumen only.

June 26. Much improved. Amt of urine 133 oz.

June 27<sup>th</sup> Very cheerful today. Amt of urine 130 oz.

June 28<sup>th</sup> Continues to improve. Urine 140 oz.

June 29<sup>th</sup> a more marked puffiness of eyelids.

Abdomen + cellular tissue of trunk still  
contains a good deal of effusion. The rest  
of the body seems almost entirely free from it.  
L. P. + R. are normal. appetite good.

June 30 Amt of urine 140 oz. Sp. Gr. 1000  
amt of albumen almost nil.

July 2<sup>nd</sup> Pneumonia has entirely subsided.  
Oedema almost nil. Except the effusion into  
abdominal cavity which is still present though  
daily growing less. No pitting on pressure can  
be detected today. Base of lungs also give  
evidence of slight oedema. Amt of urine  
168 oz. Sp. Gr. 1010.

July 3. Allowed to get up today. Continues medicine

Can read print (Common) at 18 inches  
from his eyes easily.

July 4 Out of albumen in urine increasing  
Urine today ~~48~~<sup>58</sup>oz. He goes about the ward  
actively. Complains of no bad symptoms.

July 5<sup>th</sup> Out of urine 138<sup>oz</sup> albumen still  
increasing. No casts can be found today.  
There is slight increase of oedema today  
of feet + ankles + face. Patient - pulse good  
eats + sleeps well. Skin less active but  
moist + cool. Eye right fair. He continued  
to improve steadily for the ensuing few days.

July 10<sup>th</sup> Lungs perfectly normal. Heart also  
normal. Abdomen seems entirely free fluid.  
No oedema of face, limbs or trunk. Patient  
is in excellent spirits. Out of urine for the  
last 24 hours 48<sup>oz</sup> <sup>albumen less today</sup> Skin active. Appetite  
good. Digestion also normal.

Condition of Sight. Right eye has  $\frac{15}{30}$  normal  
vision. Left  $\frac{15}{100}$ . The oedema of retina is less  
than at former examinations.  
He was allowed to go home today, being anxious  
to do so.
