*****The Montreal General Hospital some years since, put up on their grounds a fever hospital which is a separate building, it was deemed at the time perfectly safe to the other inmates, to permit Small Pox patients to be placed in this isolated building. Soon however the contagion was found to spread, and cases originating in the wards among the other patients became too common, life was sacrificed, and the committee of management at length determined to exclude the infected.***
