May 1, 1889—From the executors of A. S. Abell, for the Johns Hopkins Colored Orphan Asylum, \$1,000.00.

September 28, 1893—From Mrs. William E. Woodyear, in memory of her daughter, Rose Blanche Woodyear, for the comfort and welfare of sick children, \$5,000.00.

March 24, 1896—From the executors of the estate of a lady of Baltimore, for the erection of a Clinical Laboratory, \$10,000.00.

December 7, 1897—From Dr. Howard A. Kelly, for the erection of an addition to the Gynecological Operating Room, \$5,000.00.
