Dear Ned,

It is a very difficult thing to check the fever in tuberculosis. The cool spongings are, I think, less exhausting than the use of the powerful, depressing medicines, such as anti-pyrine, etc. Tell the doctor not to hesitate to give him enough morphia to keep him comfortable at night as it helps, too, in reducing the fever. It is terribly sad for you all. I wish I could do something morefor you.
