JULY, 1904.

We sailed together on the "Campagna", and I left them at Queenstown. T. McCrae says that they were gotten up at 4 a.m. in the Mersey, and the boat train got them into London at 12.30. Nothing would do but they must all go out to Hazelmere and see Jonathon Hutchinson, which they did, and spent all the afternoon and the evening till 10 p.m. when they got back to London, nearly dead. The Tysons were along, and poor old Jimmie was nearly finished.

I had supposed that he had gone directly from Liverpool to Edinburgh to see a doctor and that he joined us later in Oxford, but if T. McCrae is correct I was mistaken.
