

Sarah Klebs, Oxford, 7th [October 1919]
[To Miss S.M.K. at Nyon, Les Terrasses]

You were an angel to write and send those pictures, which give a most seductive impression & make one wish for an Oxford-Geneva 5 hr. aero-express. [On July 1st 1920 a regular aero-service in 3 hrs. Paris-Geneva is inaugurated]. Yours of the 24th only got here today. The delays in the Swiss post are very mysterious. I have been waiting for weeks most impatiently for a Gesner. Tell your dadie he should give us a nice life of Gesner, the greatest name in Swiss medicine.

That library annex must be a delight. My books are all over the house, but I know where they are, which is the important thing. I hope to have some incunabula questions before long for him to solve. We are just getting ready for term and are in despair at the number of students. A number of nice American boys are ~~xxxx~~ coming. We must borrow you for a term to help look after them. Of course you and Lady Osler are cousins - her father and your grandfather were I believe first cousins - Anna is her niece.. I remember that luncheon [in Rome] perfectly - and your ~~xxxx~~ shocking behavior!
