

Johns Hopkins announced the intentions for his double bequest in 1867  
In a letter dated Mar 10 1873 he directed the Hospital Board which had been in  
existence for 6 years as follows that "in all your arrangements in relation to  
this Hospital you will bear constantly in mind that it is my wish and purpose  
that the institution shall ultimately form a part of the medical school of that  
university for which I have made ample provision in my will" Thus his  
double bequest for school and university - were united.

Johns Hopkins died Dec. 24. 1873, and some time earlier in 1873 - the Trustees received  
the bequest, J. C. Gilman was chosen President and came to Baltimore May, 1875 -

Richard D. Storrs appointed secretary and trustee with him, Remond & Montgomery appointed,  
Chemistry Physics

J. C. Gilman's inauguration July 22 1876, Huxley address at the Acad. of Medicine July 22 1876  
a goodly fashion the assembly was opened without proper arrangement a storm of protest.

1879 Sir Henry Hall was to have given opening lecture on coordination between university  
and hospital. W. C. his successor in Oxford.

June 1877 Johns Hospital adopted & excavations begun, John S. Billings appeared the year before

John S. Billings for 1853-1864 <sup>was usually</sup> it is announced that the medicine department of the university

to be organized as follows  
"The nucleus of a medicine faculty has been instituted as follows J. S. Billings Lecturer  
in Hygiene; W. W. Welch Professor of Pathology; Dr. Remond Professor of Chemistry; H. Newell Markham  
Professor of Physiology"

Welch 1st course of lectures July - Mar 1886  
Course given under in Pathology started in present lab. Nov. 1 1886, Wall & Holsted, National  
for City Hospital & Bay View.

In 1887 B.O. stock fell for 10% dividend to 0. University as affairs and school  
could not be opened the hospital ready. The hospital income luckily not affected  
as derived from real estate.
