Dear Thayer.

I found Davis very much better. He returned from the yacht (Abels) feeling badly having had attacks of giddiness and nausea- once or twice vomiting as well. On Tuesday & Wednesday he had three or four fainting spells, one very prolonged & with a good deal of collapse. They then telegraphed me. I was away in Wisted Harbor & did not get back until the eve. I left on Thursday & got to Minneapolis Monday a.m. He was very much better - quite bright & it was simply impossible to realize, as we sat & talked with the poor fellow, that his condition was serious The face is much pigmented & the margin of the M.M of the lower lipnone inside mouth. No pigmentation of areola. He has gained in weight since June, Blood +. by count I have told him that we would arrange leave for six mos. which will relieve his mind very much. Talk with Brown for a substitute. We could make it pleasant for him & I think Fulcher would like him. Unfortunately I have to leave for Toronto tomorrow morning. a nephew is seriously ill." I shall (Nousday) not return here but go down to Balt direct- reaching there on the 15th." What a deuce of a summer you must have had! I had a "touch of start' ' on the train on Friday & Saturday. I saw many in St. P. & M who asked after you. It is delightful tosee the condition of the school. Their laboratory equipment is A.W. Mrs Osler came this am. I got in at 6 pm.
