Dear Mrs. Mullin

I have been encouraged by what Dr Malloch has written of your good old man; but your account is not so favorable. I am afraid that he does not take food enough. I would tempt him with all sorts of digestable things - birds sweet-breads oysters &c, and make him take the milk - or butter-milk - in the intervals between meals. He should rest on his back quietly for at least half an hour after eating. Do not let him go out at night - it is a useless waste of his strength; insist upon this point. I am very sorry to hear of the continued loss in weight; it means that his stomach is not doing its work well. I have written the young Doctor today. Do let me hear from time to time how he progresses. Harry Wrights death was a great shock. He was a fine character.
